Augmented reality (AR) is an interactive experience of a real-world environment where the objects that reside in the real world are enhanced by computer-generated perceptual information, sometimes across multiple sensory modalities, including visual, auditory, haptic, somatosensory and olfactory.

Lesson: Definition may not include or be solely based on technology.

Another Lesson from Virtual Reality

Once upon a time, virtual environments were considered virtual reality.

Now, in most cases, VR means VR headsets.

Lesson: Definition may become narrower over time.

Device-based Definition

AR includes both

- 1. AR headsets and their applications,
- 2. AR smartphone applications, until AR headsets become widespread.

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

Based on Azuma's Definition

- 1. Combines real and virtual
- 2. Interactive in real time
- 3. Registered in 3D

Headsets are more AR in 1 and 3.

The Rs

VR: Virtual Reality

MR: Mixed Reality

AR: Augmented Reality


XR: Extended Reality or X as a Unknown Variable to indicate all Rs.
